Mass on Tuesday

Please note that Mass on Tuesday morning is at the earlier time of 9am. This is to enable Canon to attend the Archdiocesan Council of Priests, which takes place later that day.

Ascension Day – Holyday of Obligation

Thursday is the Solemnity of the Ascension and a Holyday of Obligation. After a trial period when the Ascension, along with the Epiphany, were removed from the list of Holydays of Obligations, the Bishops of England and Wales have received approval from the Holy See for the reinstatement of these two days of obligation. The new rules came into effect on the 1st Sunday of Advent 2017. It means that all Catholics in England and Wales are obliged to attend Mass on Thursday, or on the Vigil of the Solemnity on Wednesday evening. Masses in the Parish are at 7pm on Wednesday at Our Lady of Lourdes and at 10am and 7pm on Thursday at St. Teilo's.

Rest in Peace

We pray for Mr. Tom Walsh and Mr. Thomas O'Driscoll who died recently. They were both faithful Catholic men. Mr. Walsh will be received into St. Teilo's at 5pm on Thursday, May 10th. His Requiem Mass will take place at St. Teilo's at 10am on Friday, May 11th, followed by internment at Pantmawr Cemetery. Details of Mr. O'Driscoll's funeral will be available shortly.

Wales and the Marches Catholic History Society

A guided visit to Newport Anglican Cathedral dedicated to St. Woolos, will take place on Wednesday, May 16th at 10.45 am under the auspices of the Catholic History Society. Tradition says that St. Gwynllyw, (Woolos), founded the Cathedral in c. 500. The legend says that he was told in a dream to search for a white ox with a black spot on its forehead and to build a church in that place, as an act of penitence. The mud and wattle structure subsequently erected became his grave, the foundation for a succession of churches built on the site at the top of Stow Hill. The extant Galilee Chapel, now called St. Mary's Chapel, still bears evidence of its early Celtic foundation, although the main construction is Norman. Places are available for this event and will be allotted on a first come, first served basis. There is no charge for the day, but we will make a collection for the Cathedral. We have arranged to have lunch in Vittorio's Restaurant opposite the Cathedral, but this is optional.
