Feasts of the Week

This week we celebrate two days which have only recently been added to the Church's calendar. On Monday we celebrate Mary, Mother of the Church and on Thursday we celebrate Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest

Mary, Mother of the Church

Blessed Pope Paul the Sixth proclaimed Mary under the title of Mother of the Church on 21 November 1964 and decreed that this title should be added to the Litany of Our Lady and other devotions. He said that "the Mother of God should be further honoured and invoked by the entire Christian people by this tenderest of titles – Mother of the Church". This year Pope Francis added this memorial to the Roman Calendar for the whole church. The decree celebrating the memorial says: "Having attentively considered how greatly the promotion of this devotion might encourage the growth of the maternal : "Having attentively considered how greatly the promotion of this devotion might encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety, Pope Francis has decreed that the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, should be inscribed in the Roman Calendar on the Monday after Pentecost and be now celebrated every year. This celebration will help us to remember that growth in the Christian life must be anchored to the Mystery of the Cross, to the oblation of Christ in the Eucharistic Banquet and to the Mother of the Redeemer and Mother of the Redeemed, the Virgin who makes her offering to God."

Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest

This celebration in honour of the priesthood of Jesus, and of all the priests who serve the Church 'in persona Christi,' was established by Pope Benedict during the Year of the Priest – 2009-10. At the request of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, made in a letter dated 11 December 2012, the Congregation for Divine Worship has agreed that the celebration shall be a Feast in England and Wales and celebrated on the Thursday after Pentecost each year, beginning in 2018.

Successful Fundraising Event – Our Lady of Lourdes

Last Saturday evening at Our Lady of Lourdes, the Cheese and Wine Evening to raise funds for the Tenovus Cancer Charity took place.
